ANTIOCH PARKS & RECREATION

We are now taking registration for our **parent and tot "Time For Me Two" class** for children aged 2 and 3 (children must be 2 years old by September 1, 2007 to participate). This class is a unique experience between a parent/guardian and child. Classes are filled on a first come, first serve basis and will begin on Friday, September 14th and run through May 2nd, 2008. First session payment will be due at registration. Fees are \$55 per session for Antioch Residents (60002 zip code) and \$65 for non-residents. Payment sessions are every 7 weeks. You will be informed of the start of each new session and payment will be due on the first day of that session or sooner. Your child is automatically enrolled into the next session, unless you inform us otherwise. Classes are an hour and a half, once a week on Fridays and are held at the Scout House at 770 Cunningham Dr. There are two time slots available 9:00-10:30 a.m. or 11:00-12:30 p.m. There is a limit of 10 children per class.

Antioch residents (60002 zip code) can now purchase tickets for our 9th annual **Mother/Son Bowling Night**. The event will be held on Sunday September 16th from 4:00-6:00 p.m. at the Antioch Bowling Lanes. Tickets are \$20 per couple and \$10 for an additional son (non-residents \$30). Two games of bowling, a memorable photo and refreshments (hot dog, chips and a pop) will be included along with shoe rental. Bumper bowling will be made available upon request. Because this is a family event, there will be no smoking or drinking of alcohol allowed. Limited amount of tickets sold so purchase early! Tickets for non-residents will go on sale September 4th if still available.

PARKING REMINDER

Please be courteous to your neighbors and keep in mind the following state statute when parking vehicles in your driveway.

Stopping, standing or parking is prohibited in specified places except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic, or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic-control device, no person shall: Stop, stand or park a vehicle:

- A. On the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street;
- B. On a sidewalk;
- C. Within an intersection;
- D. On a crosswalk;
- E. Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb.

LAWN WATERING AND SPRINKLER REGULATIONS

Village ordinance restricts exterior water usage during the high-demand summer months. The restrictions will help ensure adequate water pressure for fire safety and Antioch residents.

Between June 1 and September 15, exterior water use will be restricted as follows:

- On even-numbered calendar days, even-numbered addresses may engage in exterior water use for all purposes; except between 6:00 am and 8:00 pm where exterior water use is prohibited.

- On odd-numbered calendar days, odd-numbered addresses may engage in exterior water use for all purposes; except between 6:00 am and 8:00 pm where exterior water use is prohibited.

- Garden hose use shall be permitted at all times for the purposes of washing cars and watering of individual plants provided a shutoff nozzle is utilized which prevents the continual discharge of water from the hose.

The owner, owners or any person or persons that are in actual control of the premises where a violation of this Chapter has occurred shall be fined as follows:

- First violation in one calendar year: Written warning, no fine;

- Second violation in one calendar year: \$50 fine;

- Third and each subsequent violation in one calendar year: \$100 fine;

- Each and every day that a violation occurs shall constitute a separate offense.

LIGHTNING DETECTION SYSTEM NOW OPERATIONAL

Lightning causes an average of 80 fatalities and 300 injuries each year.

Lightning occurs in all thunderstorms; each year lightning strikes the Earth 20 million times. The energy from one lightning flash could light a 100-watt light bulb for more than 3 months.

Most lightning fatalities and injuries occur when people are caught outdoors in the summer months during the afternoon and evening. Lightning can occur from cloud-to-cloud, within a cloud, cloud-to-ground, or cloud-to-air. Many fires in the western United States and Alaska are started by lightning. The air near a lightning strike is heated to 50,000°F. The rapid heating and cooling of the air near the lightning channel causes a shock wave that results in thunder.

How far away is the Thunderstorm?

- Count the number of seconds between a flash of lightning and the next clap of thunder.
- Divide this number by 5 to determine the distance to the lightning in miles.

Why are we telling you all of this?

Recently the Village of Antioch Parks Department purchased a system that will help pre-warn people participating in our parks of lightning nearing the area.

Currently three notification systems are in place and operational. They are located at Williams Park, Centennial Park and Pedersen Park. Park patrons and nearby residents will hear a warning siren when lightning is detected within 5 miles of the sensor equipment (located on top of the Village Hall). If the sensor equipment goes for a period of time (typically 30 minutes) without sensing additional lightning, an all clear siren will be activated. The system will be activated between 8 AM until 9 PM, throughout the summer and early fall. This can be changed based on actual park activities.

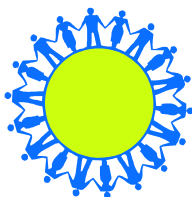
