

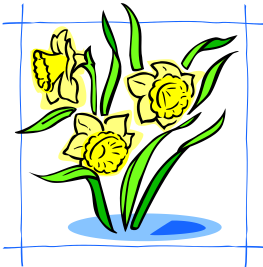

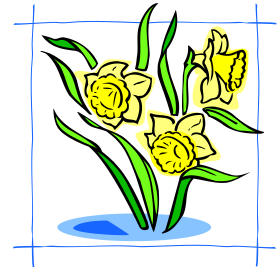

PHOSPHORUS BAN

Last year the Village Board of Trustees passed an ordinance banning the use of fertilizer containing phosphorus within Village limits in order to limit the concentration of phosphorus in the Village's lakes, rivers and streams. Wherever fertilizer is sold within Village limits, a sign must be posted that reads "The Village of Antioch prohibits the application of fertilizer containing phosphorus to any lawn or turf area and any impervious surface, drainage way, wetland or buffer zone". Please be sure when you purchase fertilizer that it does not contain phosphorus.

ATTENTION FUTURE POOL OWNERS

Village of Antioch residents, please contact the Building Department BEFORE you purchase a swimming pool. Supplements with installation, electrical and placement requirements are available at the Building Dept. located at 882 Main St. Also, any pool whether temporary or storable which is 24 inches or more in depth also requires a permit. Any questions, please call 847-395-9462.

CONSTRUCTION PERMITS

Residents and Homeowners Associations requesting notification of construction related permits in their subdivision now have the opportunity to register with the Village. Though the Village itself does not have the authority to enforce private covenants, providing the homeowners' and merchants' associations of the Village an opportunity to be made aware of construction within covenant controlled developments and subdivisions improves coordination and communication in two parallel, yet separate processes.

For properties within the Village that are subject to private covenants, conditions, or restrictions, the following procedure will be administered in conjunction with the building and site permit process. In situations where emergency actions may be required, the Village reserves the right to forgo the understated processes in order to allow the abatement of nuisances or potential hazards.

1) The agent or administrator of the private covenants shall register with the Village Board of Trustees in writing, with a request to notify the agent or administrator of an application for issuance of construction or development related permits pursuant to Section 9-1-3 (F) of the Village Code.

Said request shall include:

- a. A reaffirmation and nature of the request;
- b. The name of the Covenant Administrator or appointed body lawfully charged with the administration of the covenants;
- c. A statement indicating that the owners represented by the administrator and bound by the covenants have assented to the administrator/agent's representative authority;
- d. A list of the subject properties or subdivisions in question (as identified by PIN or common address); and
- e. Updated contact information, including fax, phone, email, and mailing address, for the dissemination of relevant building related correspondence.

The Village Board will hear the request at a regularly scheduled meeting and determine that the information supplied is sufficient and meets the intent of the ordinance.

2) For each property in the Village there may be only one registered Covenant Administrator for the purpose of receiving notice of applications for construction or development-related permits.

3) Once registered by the Village, permits for registered properties and subdivisions that lack acknowledgement letters from the registered Covenant Administrator will not be reviewed by the Building or Engineering Departments, **except as followed:**

- a. Upon submission of a completed permit application that lacks an acknowledgment letter, the Building Department shall attempt to contact the

registered Covenant Administrator in writing and shall make a record of the notification within the Building Permit File. Notice to the Covenant Administrator shall be by first class mail to the last address provided to the Village.

b. Once the letter to the Covenant Administrator is submitted, the Building Department will hold the permit for no longer than 14 calendar days prior to the review of the permit. Once the 14 days has lapsed, or upon written notification from the Covenant Administrator, whichever is first, the permit shall enter into the review process pursuant to Title 9 of the Village Code.

c. Any deadline or duration for review of construction or development-related permit applications provided for by state or local law shall be stayed during the notice and acknowledgment period provided for herein.

Associations that wish to participate in this notification process should read and make application to the Village Board. If you have questions regarding the process or registration please call Dustin Nilsen or Bill Rantz, Village of Antioch Planning, Building, and Zoning at (847) 395-9462.

ANTIOCH SWIM TEAM

The Antioch Waves summer program begins at the end of May and runs through July, Dual meets are scheduled every Tuesday and some Thursdays in the evenings, with a few Saturday meets. Registration is on a first-come-first-serve basis.

To join the swim team, swimmers must be able to swim the length of the Antioch pool unassisted and be between 5 and 18 years of age. Previous swim lessons are helpful. Evaluations will be held prior to the start of practice to test new swimmer's ability.

Registration will be held on Sunday, April 13, 2008, at the Senior Center 1-5 p.m. Fees are \$140 (1st child), \$130 (2nd child), \$125 (3rd child or high school child). This fee includes team participation, t-shirt, swim cap, and attendance awards presented at our picnic. Registration forms will also be made available at the Parks Department and on the Antioch Waves website. If registration fee is paid by May 15, 2008, a discount of \$10.00/swimmer applies.

Accepted Materials - oil-based paints, paint thinner/remover, furniture stripper, hobby chemicals, aerosol products, cleaning supplies, gasoline & antifreeze, used motor oil, solvents, mercury, asbestos, pesticides, pool chemicals, driveway sealer, fluorescent light bulbs, prescription medications, household batteries.

To help you determine if something is a household chemical waste, look for words "danger," "toxic," "flammable," "corrosive," and/or "reactive" somewhere on the product's packaging.

All HCW collections sponsored by SWALCO (the Solid Waste Agency of Lake County) are for Illinois residents ONLY. You do not need to reside in the community where the collection takes place in order to participate.

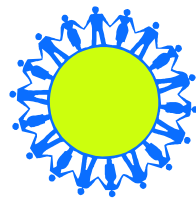

COMMUNITY SERVICES & ORGANIZATIONS

ANTIOCH FINE ARTS FOUNDATION

Barbara Wagner and Bonnielynn Brankey are the featured White Room Artists at The Antioch Fine Arts Foundation (AFAF) for April. AFAF, a not-for-profit organization, is dedicated to the education and promotion of art in and around Lake County Illinois.

Barbara Wagner is a self-taught, recent member of AFAF and new resident of Antioch. Private lessons in oil and pastel as a child fueled her interest in art. Her talent was honed in Gurnee for 20 years studying folk art from countries around the world. During her career she has developed a traditional, romantic style focusing on still life, floral, and landscape subjects which were showcased in Richmond at her own successful storefront and gallery. During her career, she's worked closely with interior decorators producing hand-painted murals, furniture, and canvas floor cloths. Through independent study, she has mastered and now teaches the Grisaille Method (gray tones in French), which emphasizes the importance of value more than color in creating shape, form, and dimension. She tutors all ages and levels of artists in drawing and painting with acrylic and oil: adults during the winter; 4th graders through high school during the summer.

Bonnielynn Brankey's show last April in our White room featured colorful and inspirational marine art. Since April she's traveled to "The Florida Dive Show" in West Palm Beach, Florida and to "Our World Under Water" in Chicago for the largest consumer Trade Show in the Midwest displaying her work. Her passion for rescuing our planet along with its' marine life continues, however, her show this year depicts original oil and watercolor landscapes, aptly named "Artistic Wanderings." Images such as Mt. McKinley, Glacier Park in Montana, rural back roads of Northern Wisconsin are first captured by camera and subsequently translated to canvas in the tranquil, muted tones of her interpretive style. Bonnielynn holds a degree in art and has been painting for over 40 years. During this time she's painted both residential and commercial murals from private baths to dive shops to dental offices. Barbara and Bonnielynn's work will be on display for the entire month of April at our Gallery located at 83 Main Street, Antioch. 
