## **PARKING IN THE VILLAGE DURING SNOW**

A. It shall be unlawful for the owner or operator of any vehicle to park said vehicle on any street in the village for a period longer than three (3) minutes for the loading or unloading of passengers, or for thirty (30) minutes for the loading or unloading of property at any time after snow begins to fall and exceeds one inch (1") of thickness, and said prohibition against parking shall continue until the snowplowing operations have ceased. Furthermore, for the purpose of facilitating the cleaning of streets, it shall be unlawful for the operator of any vehicle to stop, stand, or park such vehicle upon any street in the village between the hours of three o'clock (3:00) A.M. and six o'clock (6:00) A.M. on Tuesdays and Fridays on any week of each year.

B. It shall be unlawful for any business or individual, while snowplowing their driveway or another's driveway within the corporate limits of the village, to push, place, or shovel snow on or across any street within the village.

C. The penalties for violation of this section shall be those as outlined in subsection 7-3-1D2 <<http://66.113.195.234/IL/Antioch/09003000000001000.htm#7-3-1>> of this chapter. (1976 Code § 76.004)

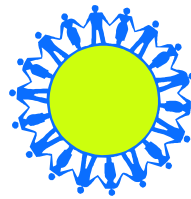
## ANTIOCH FINE ARTS FOUNDATION

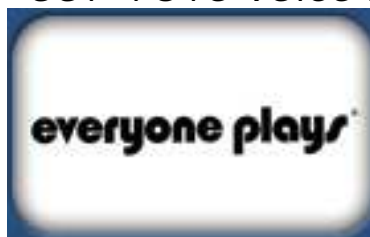
